The T'Sou-ke First Nation supports the Sea to Sea Greenbelt Society's request for an investigation into the Minister of Forests decision to approve the removal of Western Forest Products private lands from TFL's 6, 19 and 25. T'Sou-ke has serious concerns about that decision. It involves the privatization of more land in its Traditional Territory, which is becoming increasingly developed and unavailable to T'Sou-ke. The Government of British Columbia refuses to consult with T'Sou-ke about its Aboriginal title claim, on the basis that T'Sou-ke surrendered its Territory through its Douglas Treaty (a position that T'Sou-ke strongly disputes for a number of reasons). Thus, as with all forestry decisions, T'Sou-ke was never consulted about the impact of this privatization on its Aboriginal title interests.

The T'Sou-ke Nation support this request for a transparent, public review of the decision by the Auditor General.

I am writing on behalf of the Otter Point & Shirley Residents & Ratepayers Association (OPSRRA) to state our support for the request that the Auditor General conduct a formal and complete examination of the Province's decision of January 25th and 31st, 2007 to remove the private forest lands of Western Forest products from TFL 25.

One purpose of our association is to ensure that development in the communities of Shirley and Otter Point happens in an orderly manner and in the best interests of its residents. In our opinion the province's decision was made without consideration of its impact on our two communities, without any consideration of the public interest and in a manner that prevented any public comment or discussion. Here is the basis of our concern and the reasons why we support the Auditor General's examination of the province's decision.

- 1. The area west of Sooke through to Port Renfrew is facing tremendous development pressure as large parcels of land—mostly previously used for forestry—are now for sale for residential development. This has the potential of radically changing land use patterns, taxation and community services in our area. As small, unincorporated, rural communities we are not ready for it:
 - Our present zoning bylaw is out-of-date and the drafting of a new one has been delayed for over a year;
 - CRD mapping of the area to identify sensitive eco-systems such as wetlands, streams and watersheds is incomplete;
 - Stronger local bylaws are needed to protect watersheds, potable water sources and other environmental features.

- The Juan de Fuca Electoral Area Parks Plan for the area is still in an early draft stage;
- The CRD Master Parks Plan will not be officially updated to include planning for the area until 2010;
- The CRD's Regional Growth Strategy is coming-up for review in 2008, at which time the framework for future development in this area will be reviewed;
- Fire protection is non-existent in some areas;
- Community amenities such as parks and trails and community services such as fire protection, police, roads, water, septic, building inspection and bylaw enforcement will be have to be developed and maintained at taxpayers' expense;
- Our present tax base is mostly residential and very limited given the size
 of our population. Removing the private forest lands to help ease the debt
 of the forest company could result in that debt being transferred, in part, to
 the local taxpayer, who will be required to support the infrastructure that
 this amount of development will demand;
- Residents in Shirley and Otter Point are exploring governance options as many are not satisfied with the present system.
- 2. About 4,000 of the 4,500 acres being offered for sale in the Shirley/Jordan River area are within the newly approved Shirley/Jordan River Official Community Plan (OCP) boundary. The total land area covered by this OCP is 9,428 acres, of which 8,917 acres has been identified as Settlement Area (the remaining 511 acres is used for roads, parks or is in the Agricultural Land Reserve). Therefore, about 45% of the identified Settlement Area land within the Shirley/Jordan River OCP area is now on the real estate market.
- 3. The present Juan de Fuca Electoral Area zoning bylaw permits residential development on 10 acre subdivisions: with either one dwelling on each 10 acre parcel or 4 dwellings if the property is strata-titled (4-on-10). This bylaw is out-of-date and is presently being re-written. That process needs to be completed before large parcels of Rural A land come forward for development.
- 4. There was no community consultation on this decision. OPSRRA wrote the Minister of Forests in February of 2007 when Western Forest Products first announced that it had asked the province for permission to remove their private forest lands from Tree Farm Licence (TFL) 25. Our letter asked that the province delay making that decision until numerous things had happened:

- The OCPs for Otter Point and Shirley/Jordan River were completed.
- The Resource Lands OCP was completed.
- · New zoning bylaws for the area were completed.
- The Otter Point & Shirley <u>Developing a Strategic Vision</u> project (which is currently underway and due for completion by September 2008) had completed its report.

The Minister replied in May, 2007 informing us that: the decision had already been made; he had no ability to restrict the sale of private lands which were now outside of the TFL; and that we should be speaking to WFP regarding our concerns.

The above are identified areas that need to be addressed. Unless the community takes the time to properly plan for growth, the only certainty is that there will continue to be uncertainty about how our community will look a decade from now.

I am writing on behalf of the Juan de Fuca Community Trails Society which was incorporated in 2005 to support the development of trail systems for community health, alternate transportation, recreation and as a resource for the growing eco-tourism industry. We support the request that the Auditor General conduct a formal and complete examination of:

- the Minister of Forests and Range's decision of January 25 and 31, 2007 to delete Tree Farm Licenses 6, 19, and 25 on private lands held by Western Forest Products (WFP) from, and
- related government management of finances and resources.

We draw to your attention that the Capital Regional District Parks Master Plan developed in 2000 does not address in detail planning for parks, trails and greenspace west of the Sooke River. This phase of planning was to begin in 2010. The Juan de Fuca Electoral Area Parks and Recreation Commission is currently preparing a new long range parks plan for the Electoral Area. It attempts to identify the areas that the public currently use for recreation so that they will be considered for park acquisition in all such future plans.

We draw to your attention that until 2007, local planning has assumed that the Forest Lands in the area are part of the inventory of conservation green space and recreational green space. Residents of the Electoral Area have therefore always used this space for recreation and with loss of access there is no alternative. Also, the Sensitive Ecosystem Survey does not extend west of the Sooke River. Changing land use suddenly places all of those values at risk.

The sudden release of land from the timber licenses directly to the real estate market endangers planning for the orderly development of our area. By changing land use and resource management without public consultation, the Ministry of Forests and Range does not serve the interest of the residents of area. The Ministry also compromises the interest of future residents, who would also benefit from public access to recreational green space and opportunities to establish eco-tourism businesses which will depend on the conservation of wildlife habitat and access to identified resources such as view points and areas of exceptional natural beauty and interest.

The action of releasing the requirements of the tree farm licenses without compensation for loss of accepted community values and without consultation is perceived as a breach of public trust. This needs to be addressed.

We feel that the public interest would be served if the tree farm licenses were to be re-imposed; or, if that were not practicable, if the government were to provide an alternative public benefit in the form of such significant tracts of land and foreshore as identified to support ecological and recreational values.


